



## **Become a Mount Sutro Open Space Volunteer!**

Mount Sutro needs your help! We need volunteers to help restore and conserve the Mount Sutro Open Space Reserve, a wilderness area situated in the heart of the city. Mount Sutro's dense eucalyptus forest and fog-shrouded slopes are home to an amazing variety of vegetation and wildlife habitat. The summit native plant garden and expanding trail network are a quiet refuge for neighbors, visitors and UCSF students and staff.

**Mt. Sutro Stewards volunteers meet on the first Saturday of each month to:**

- **Maintain** and improve the existing trail network
- **Remove** and prune invasive blackberry, ivy and weeds
- **Help sustain** native plants in the summit garden and nearby demonstration areas.

**All scheduled work dates will have both habitat restoration and trail work activities.**
